

<p style="text-align: center;">Memory Timeline</p> <p>Create a timeline of major events in your life. Identify the “who, what, when, where, and how” of each event. A minimum of seven events are required.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Observational Research</p> <p>Identify a behavior you have always exhibited that you would like to understand better. Develop a plan to collect time series data to help you better understand the occurrence of the behavior.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Professional Interview</p> <p>Conduct interviews to collect data from adults in your life. People you might interview: Teachers, coaches, counselors, advisers, parents of your friends</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Archival Research</p> <p>Learn something new about yourself by analyzing historical data that have been accumulated over your lifetime. Examples: family records, Facebook feed, memorabilia school, photo albums</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Focus Group Interview</p> <p>Conduct interviews to collect data from your peers. People you might interview: Classmates, team members, friends, people you know from activities outside school</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Photovoice</p> <p>Using your primary research question, take pictures in your community, at home, and at school that will reveal something new about yourself, your cultural setting, and the people you know. Provide narration.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Personal Interview</p> <p>Conduct interviews to collect data from people in your family. People you might interview: Parents, cousins, aunts/uncles, grandparents</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Primary Sources</p> <p>Learn something new about yourself by analyzing direct or first hand evidence. Examples of evidence: Works of art or writing created by you, audio/video recordings of you, journal entries</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Survey Research</p> <p>Develop a survey to collect data from multiple groups of people in multiple settings (school, social, family). Example survey sample: Friends, classmates, teammates, teachers, advisors</p>
